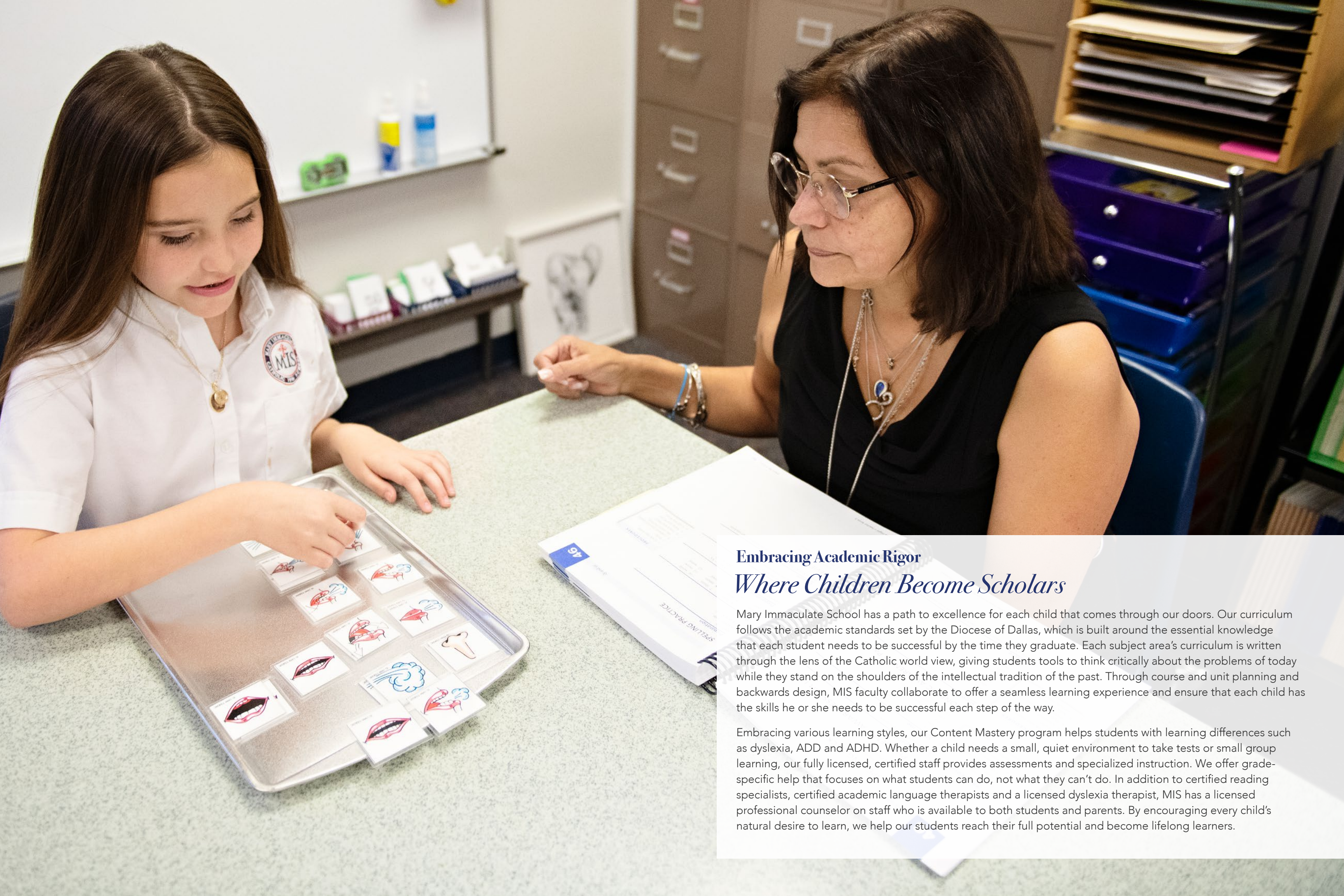

Embracing Academic Rigor

Where Children Become Scholars

Mary Immaculate School has a path to excellence for each child that comes through our doors. Our curriculum follows the academic standards set by the Diocese of Dallas, which is built around the essential knowledge that each student needs to be successful by the time they graduate. Each subject area's curriculum is written through the lens of the Catholic world view, giving students tools to think critically about the problems of today while they stand on the shoulders of the intellectual tradition of the past. Through course and unit planning and backwards design, MIS faculty collaborate to offer a seamless learning experience and ensure that each child has the skills he or she needs to be successful each step of the way.

Embracing various learning styles, our Content Mastery program helps students with learning differences such as dyslexia, ADD and ADHD. Whether a child needs a small, quiet environment to take tests or small group learning, our fully licensed, certified staff provides assessments and specialized instruction. We offer grade-specific help that focuses on what students can do, not what they can't do. In addition to certified reading specialists, certified academic language therapists and a licensed dyslexia therapist, MIS has a licensed professional counselor on staff who is available to both students and parents. By encouraging every child's natural desire to learn, we help our students reach their full potential and become lifelong learners.

Flourishing in Faith

Where Children Seek Holiness

With the help of the Nashville Dominicans and a deeply committed faculty and staff, MIS teaches students the Gospel message and expands their knowledge of the Creator and His creation, especially the human person made in His image. Our graduates are well prepared to bring the love of Christ, love of Mary and love of the Church to their high schools and the world beyond to create the foundation on which they live their lives.

Love for the Church

Our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium is a prayerful space where students encounter the celebration of the liturgical year, the Mass, and scripture in a Montessori-based, hands-on way.

Love for Mary

Under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, our school is dedicated to the Blessed Mother. Throughout the church year, children celebrate her feasts under titles such as Our Lady of Guadalupe and Our Lady of the Rosary. A school-wide Solemn Rosary, May Crowning, and Living Rosary foster an affection for and devotion to our heavenly Mother. At the end of each Mass, the school community sings the *Salve Regina*.

Love for the Eucharist

Weekly Mass as a school community is the cornerstone of the faith life of Mary Immaculate. Celebrating the liturgy with reverence and devotion, children take part in all aspects of the Mass from being lectors and gift bearers to being cantors and altar servers. In addition, students are brought to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament for adoration as a whole school community.

Virtues in Practice

The Virtues in Practice curriculum, designed by the Nashville Dominican Sisters, highlights a virtue for study each month. Creating a common language around virtues enriches the faith community of faculty, students and families.

Service

MIS students are engaged in service learning that emphasizes reciprocity and deep respect for all people. From exploring the impacts of their actions to researching and advocating for their causes, students engage in direct and indirect service at every level to care for God's creation and His people.

Athletics

Our athletic programs are an excellent opportunity to build teamwork while promoting active lifestyle habits and teaching good sportsmanship. MIS has athletic traditions spanning decades with multiple championships. Programs offered at MIS include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, futsal, softball, track, volleyball, swimming and tennis. As a member of the Dallas Parochial League, coaches are all formed through the Play Like a Champion Today program, which uses moral development to create an environment where each child can grow to his or her potential through sports in a supportive and positive athletic culture.

Fine Arts

Truth, beauty, and goodness are timeless attributes of being that reflect the One who is True, Good, and Beautiful. Students encounter beauty through Fine Arts starting at a very young age. Twice-weekly Music classes for young learners lead to more specialized study of an instrument in Band, or more in-depth work in Choir. Students also grow in appreciation for a wide variety of music. Art classes are offered for all students and incorporate study of a variety of media as well as an appreciation for classic and Christian art and artists.

Spanish

Beginning in Pre-K4, Spanish is introduced to students with twice-weekly classes in Spanish language and culture. Our award-winning Primary Spanish teacher has led the way in creating engaging and animated lessons. Spanish culture is also woven throughout the learning experience of the school. A *posada* at Christmas and *Ballet Folklórico* bring appreciation for the Hispanic culture that permeates Texas.

Diverse Population

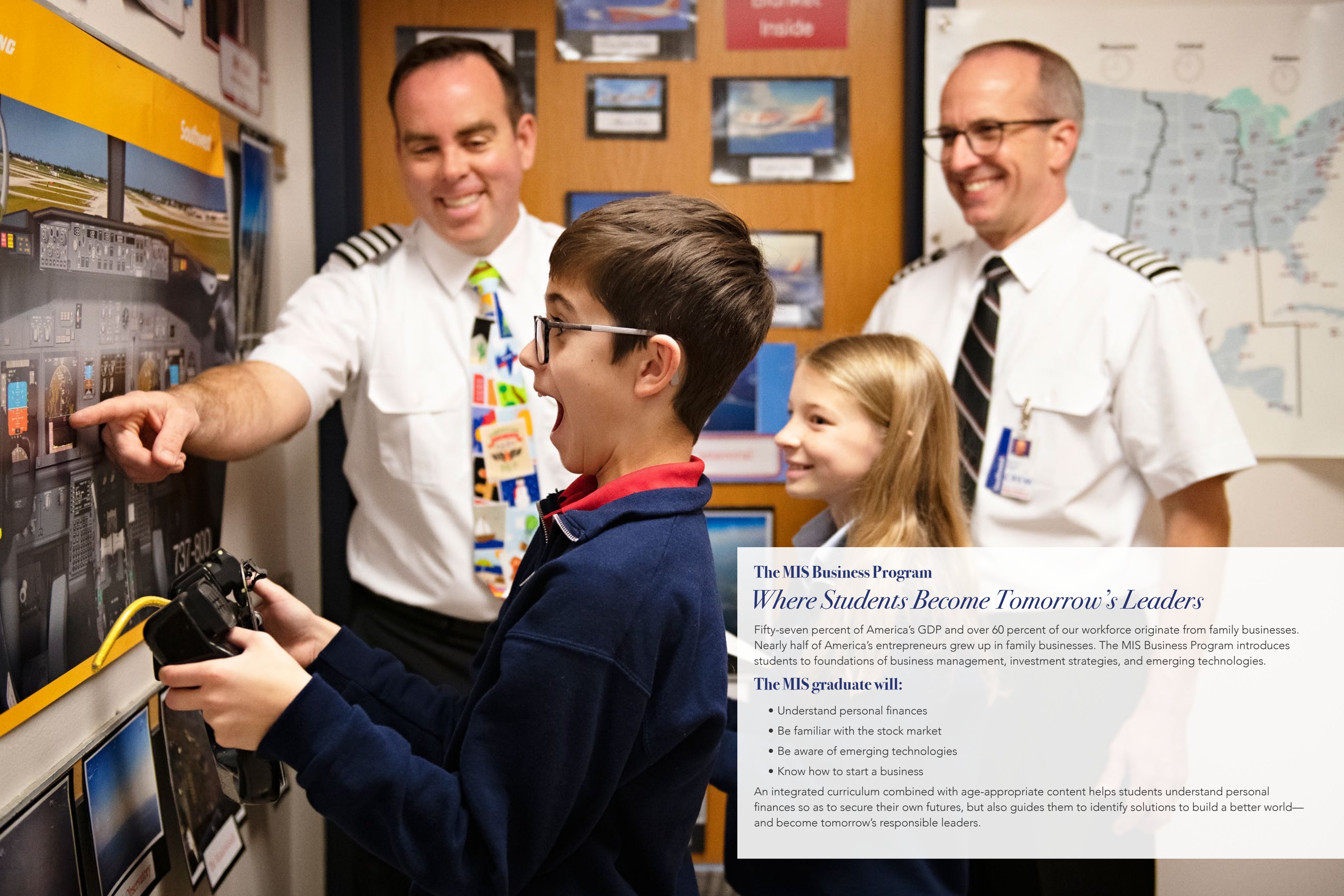
